	Well-Worn (WW)	0.38--	0.45	Significant wear, fading colors, and prominent scratches.
	Battle-Scarred (BS)	0.45--	1.00	Greatly distressed, rusted, or scraped away, frequently offering the weapon a gritty, industrial appearance.

The CS2 Economy: Rarity Tiers

Skins are classified into different rarity tiers, which determine their drop rates in-game or acquisition rates through weapon cases. Understanding these tiers is necessary for anybody looking to understand the marketplace worth of their inventory.

- **Customer Grade (White):** Common, basic weapon surfaces, typically found in weekly gameplay drops.
- **Industrial Grade (Light Blue):** Slightly less typical than customer grade, but still generally low-value.
- **Mil-Spec (Dark Blue):** The standard baseline for the majority of collection and case skins.
- **Limited (Purple):** Often forms the middle tier of case drops; visually striking and reasonably priced.

- **Special Item (Gold/Exotic):** The rarest tier, encompassing knives and agent gloves.
