The Five Wear Categories

To assist players understand the physical condition of a weapon at a glance, Valve classified float values into five unique tiers:

Condition Name	Float Value Range	Visual Description
Factory New (FN)	0.00-- 0.07	Pristine condition with little to no visible scratches or wear.
Very Little Wear (MW)	0.07-- 0.15	Very minor imperfections, typically just noticeable upon close inspection.
Field-Tested (FT)	0.15-- 0.38	Obvious wear, scratches, and minor paint chipping on high-friction areas.
Well-Worn (WW)	0.38-- 0.45	Considerable wear, fading colors, and prominent scratches.
Battle-Scarred (BS)	0.45-- 1.00	Heavily distressed, rusted, or scraped away, often giving the weapon a gritty, commercial look.

The CS2 Economy: Rarity Tiers

Skins are classified into different rarity tiers, which dictate their drop rates in-game or acquisition rates by means of weapon cases. Understanding these tiers is necessary for anybody wanting to understand the market worth of their stock.

- **Consumer Grade (White):** Common, basic weapon finishes, normally found in weekly gameplay drops.
- **Industrial Grade (Light Blue):** Slightly less typical than consumer grade, but still generally low-value.
- **Mil-Spec (Dark Blue):** The basic baseline for many collection and case skins.
- **Restricted (Purple):** Often forms the middle tier of case drops; aesthetically striking and fairly priced.
- **Classified (Pink):** High-tier weapons that include intricate artwork and command considerable market attention.
- **Covert (Red):** The greatest standard weapon tier, featuring the most sought-after rifle and SMG finishes in the game.
- **Unique Item (Gold/Exotic):** The rarest tier, encompassing knives and representative gloves.

How to Acquire CS2 Skins

Gamers have multiple opportunities to get and expand their digital arsenals, ranging from casual gameplay to active market trading.

- **Weekly Care Packages:** By playing on main servers and leveling up when a week, gamers get a care bundle enabling them to pick a few totally free graffiti or weapon drops.
- **Opening Cases:** Players can purchase or make weapon cases and use a matching secret (purchased from the in-game store) to open a random skin. *Keep in mind: This functions similarly to a lottery game system and relies greatly on possibility.*
- **The Steam Community Market:** The official, controlled community where gamers purchase and sell skins using Steam Wallet funds.
- **Third-Party Trading Platforms:** Independent markets enable users to purchase and sell skins for real-world fiat currency or cryptocurrency, often including lower charges and more robust trading tools.

Tips for Trading and Collecting Safely

Since high-tier CS2 skins can command rates equivalent to high-end cars or property, the community is unfortunately targeted by malicious actors, scammers, and phishers. Anybody participating in the skin economy ought to follow rigorous safety protocols:



- **Enable Steam Guard:** Always use the Steam Guard Mobile Authenticator to secure your account versus unapproved logins and trades.
- **Beware of API Scams:** Never log into third-party websites utilizing your Steam credentials unless you have actually completely confirmed their credibility. Fraudsters frequently utilize phony login websites to hijack user API secrets and intercept trades.
