Why a local locksmith matters most

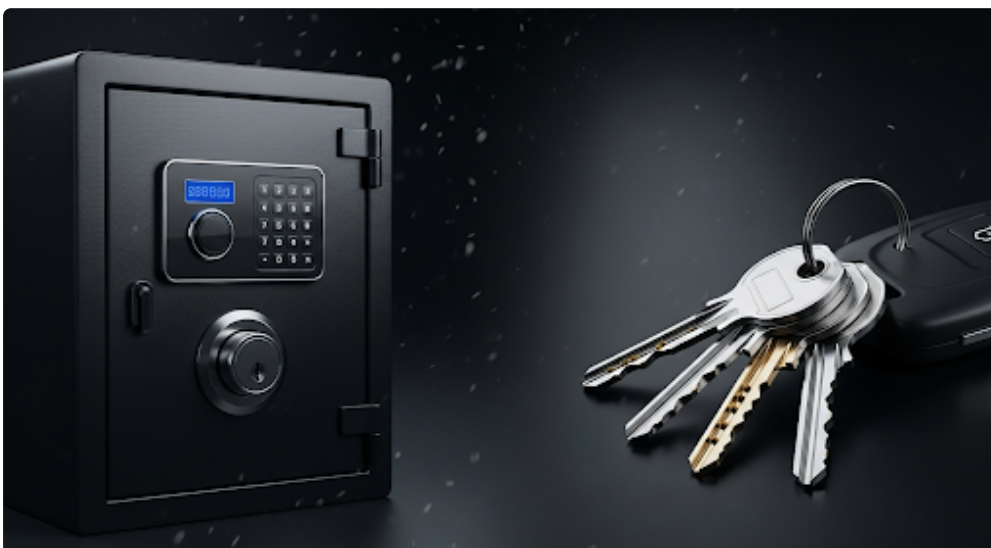
