- **Scrap:** The primary currency of *Rust*. Used at Research Tables to open plans and at Outpost/Bandit Camp vending makers to buy high-tier items.

2. Defense and Combat Gear

Fight is the beating heart of *Rust*. Gamers advance from primitive bone clubs to ravaging military-grade assault rifles.

- **Primitive Tier:** Bows, crossbows, machetes, and waterpipe shotguns. Highly efficient in the early hours of a wipe.
- **Mid Tier:** Custom SMGs, Thompson submachine guns, and semi-automatic rifles (SARs). These are the workhorses of mid-game PvP and monolith raiding.
- **Endgame Tier:** Assault Rifles (LR-300 and AK), Bolt Action Rifles, and M92 Pistols, coupled with heavy Metal Armor sets.

Quick Reference: Top-Tier Weapon Statistics

For players aiming to enhance their loadouts for PvP encounters, comprehending weapon stats is essential. Below is a comparative table of some of the most popular guns in *Rust*.

1. **Find or Buy the Item:** Loot it from a military cage, elite tier crate, or acquire it from a safe zone vendor.
2. **Bring it Home Safely:** Transport the item to base without getting assailed by rival gamers.
3. **Research study:** Place the item on a Research Table in addition to the needed amount of **Scrap** to learn its blueprint completely.
4. **Unlock via Tech Tree:** Alternatively, players can spend scrap straight on a Workbench Tech Tree to open items sequentially without requiring the physical item first.

The Economics of Recycling

A huge feature comprehensive extensively in the Rust Items Wiki is the **Recycler**, found most significantly at monoliths like the Supermarket, Oxum's Gas Station, and the Outpost. Dropping surplus parts into a recycler breaks them down into raw materials and, most importantly, **scrap**.

- **Parts with High Scrap Yields:**
 - **Tech Trash:** Yields state-of-the-art parts, computer systems, and valuable scrap.
 - **Metal Pipes & Metal Springs:** Essential for crafting mid-to-high-tier weapons and armor without relying completely on random drops.

- **Road Signs & Gears:** Crucial for updating primitive armor into Road Sign armor sets.
