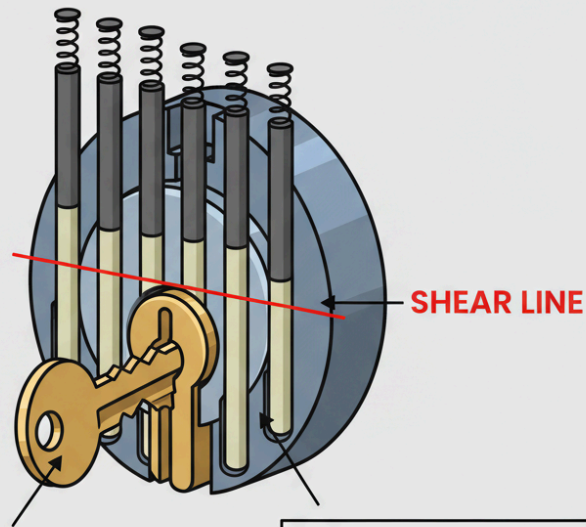
A practical way to think about value
