

Garage Door Repair Price Range at a Glance

The usual **garage door repair cost** in Los Angeles often falls between \$150 and \$700 for a common repair, although complex work can cost more. A basic adjustment, lubrication, or sensor correction may be fairly affordable, while a broken spring, damaged panel, failed garage door opener, or structural problem can require a more substantial investment.

Average Garage door repair Costs by Problem

The main factor in an average repair cost is the failed component. A garage door that makes a loud garage door sound may only need oiling or roller replacement. A broken spring is a potential hazard because springs support much of the door's weight. A bent track can cause the door to bind or become a door off track. Most residential systems use either a **torsion spring** mounted above the door or one or more **extension spring** assemblies along the horizontal tracks. A torsion spring generally offers consistent movement and is common on

modern residential doors. Extension spring systems may be found on older installations and require proper safety cables and hardware.

Garage Door Panel and Track Repair Costs

A **garage door panel** may cost approximately \$250–\$1,000 or more to repair or replace, depending on the material, finish, windows, insulation, and whether a matching panel is still available. A small dent in a steel garage door may be fixable, while a crushed or warped section may require replacement. Wood, custom, and insulated sections can cost substantially more than basic stamped steel sections.

Garage door track repairs commonly range from \$150–\$400.
