1. Verify the Integrity of Game Files

3. Change Launch Options

- **Third-Party Antivirus:** Temporarily whitelist the CS: GO setup folder or run the game with Windows Defender to ensure security suites aren't incorrectly flagging video game files as threats.

5. Inspect for Hardware Overheating and Overclocking

- **Clean out physical dust** from PC fans and heat sinks every 3-- 6 months.

- **Run a disk check (CHKDSK)** periodically to make sure the storage drive housing CS: GO has no bad sectors.
- **Avoid alt-tabbing excessively** throughout loading screens, as this is a well-known trigger for Source engine crashes.
