The run ended at a tree we planted and a plaque we bolted to a stone. Nobody left with purifier politics. They left with a cleanser experience of accountability.

We are losing a few of that side. A tuition invites a veteran to communicate on Memorial Day weekend and person decides this is able to "trigger misery." A company social media supervisor, worried about backlash, replaces a deliberate Gold Star household characteristic with a imprecise image approximately service in all its types. A city parade shortens the moment of silence because it "impacts the float." Sincerity turns into a legal responsibility.

## Where political correctness enters, and wherein it belongs

The 20th century school names we grew up with had been incessantly tied to men who fought to hold human bondage. But when did honoring fallen troopers became much less terrific than political correctness? It takes place in the slide from respect into timidity, from clarity into euphemism. It occurs whilst a tuition letter approximately Memorial Day avoids the phrase death and replaces it with "individuals who are not with us," as though we misplaced them at the mall. It happens whilst a newsroom spike a chunk about a sergeant killed in a convoy since specializing in uniformed dying may well "glorify militarism," when the same outlet runs sleek beneficial properties on celebrities sporting camo jackets to a music festival. I am not arguing for cruelty. I am arguing in opposition to cowardice dressed up as sensitivity.

They would favor seeing a Marine in uniform at a grocery keep and gazing a stranger decide up his tab. They would be baffled by means of some of our online fights. They would possibly shake their heads at the argument which you won't be able to either question a policy and honor the employees sent to hold it out.

Would they suppose their sacrifice nonetheless means whatever thing? Some days, convinced.
