Restricted (Purple)	15.98%
Classified (Pink)	3.20%
Covert (Red)	0.64%
Rare Special Item (Gold)	-- Knife 0.25%

Thus, typically, **1 out of every 400 openings** yields a knife (or glove) skin. The precise knife model (e.g., Bayonet vs. Karambit) is selected from a pool of offered knives for that case, each equally most likely within the Rare

Special Item tier.
