## Why mobile service matters in Orlando

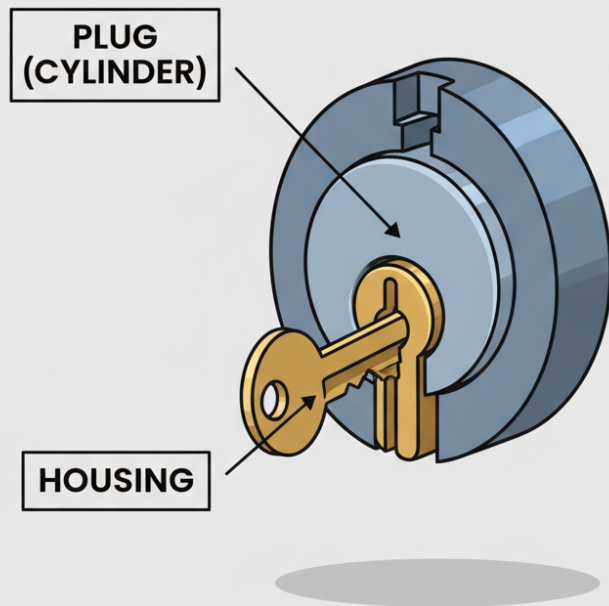
