- **Step 5: Setting the Glass:** A thin bed of glazing putty is set, the brand-new glass is pressed gently into place, and glazier's points are driven in to secure it.
- **Step 6: Applying the Final Seal:** A neat triangle of putty is used around the border of the glass, smoothed out, and delegated cure before painting.
