- **Coinflip:** A classic 1v1 game where 2 gamers wager equivalent skin worths, and a digital coin flip figures out the sole winner.

- **Prize:** Multiple players dispose skins into a typical pot. A virtual wheel spins, and the person who contributed the most has the highest analytical chance of winning the whole swimming pool, though luck can favor low-tier factors.

Necessary Safety Tips for Navigating the Ecosystem
