- **Understand Case Odds:** Research the contents and expected return value (EV) of the cases being selected. Cases with incredibly top-heavy payments (where a knife represent 90% of the case's value) are much riskier than cases with steady mid-tier items.
- **Prevent Chasing Losses:** If a bad streak occurs, withstand the desire to double the stakes in the next battle to recover funds. This is the fastest way to deplete a bankroll.
