2. **Designer Curated Drops:** Facepunch Studios evaluates the Workshop and selects a batch of skins to be included to the main item shop every Thursday.
3. **The Item Store:** Players can buy freshly released skins directly from Facepunch at a repaired, low cost (normally between £ 0.99 and £ 2.49).

4. **The Steam Market:** Once acquired, these skins have a seven-day trade/market hold. After this period, gamers can offer, purchase, or trade them on the Steam Community Market. Costs fluctuate based on rarity and popularity.

Skin Category Item Example Benefit **Camouflage** Forest Raiders/ Arctic Suit Makes the player harder to spot in specific biomes (snow, forests). **Glow-in-the-Dark** Radiant Door Skins/ Night-Vis Allows gamers to navigate their base or discover chests in pitch-black spaces without torches. **Transparent/ Mesh** Metal Facemasks with Eye Holes Uses a little better peripheral vision compared to the default, chunky model. **P2W Iron Sights** Custom-made SMG/ SAR Skins Changes cumbersome default iron sights with tidy dots or cleaner geometric shapes for better target acquisition.

- **The Glowing Meta:** Skins featuring neon lays out or glowing aspects. Vital for finding your method around a dark base during a midnight online raid defense.
- **The Tech/Sci-Fi Line:** Sleek, futuristic styles featuring metal blues, clean whites, and digital user interfaces.
- **The Horror/Grunge Theme:** Rusted iron, blood splatters, skulls, and bone motifs. Perfect for the disorderly raider aesthetic.
- **The Camouflage Sets:** Biome-specific sets like the *Arctic*, *Desert Raider*, or *Forest Camo* series.
