Dermatofibroma-- likewise referred to as benign coarse histiocytoma-- is a slow-growing, benign skin nodule

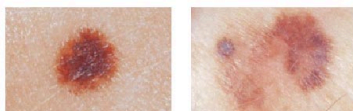

They are commonly located on the top trunk and extremities, in center aged ladies, and dimpling is characteristically present. In addition, acanthosis is often observed.^{5,13,14,19-- 21} Histologically, hemosiderotic DF demonstrates multifocal interstitial hemorrhage with hefty hemosiderin deposition (Figure 3a and b). The lump expands in the dermis-- the thick layer of cells below the epidermis-- yet often expands into the subcutaneous cells-- the deepest layer of skin. You can have one dermatofibroma or numerous, however numerous dermatofibromas aren't as typical as creating a single sore. If there's any type of uncertainty, a tiny example of the tissue may be removed and examined under a microscopic lense. This confirms the diagnosis and rules out uncommon but extra severe problems like dermatofibrosarcoma protuberans (a very rare skin cancer). This sore typically causes no signs besides the changes in skin appearance, though they can come to be scratchy or perhaps unpleasant. The histopathologic functions include hyperplasia of the epidermis and basic cell hyperpigmentation layer, which is called the 'dirty finger nail' sign. Nevertheless, numerous histological versions do take place, consisting of mobile, aneurysmal, atrophic, and irregular dermatofibroma. Consequently it dimples conveniently when the skin is lightly pressed from the sides of the lesion.

RECOGNIZING SKIN CANCER

If a mole looks just like it has for the last 20 years, it's probably benign.
The most important thing to look for is a change: a new spot, a mole that is growing or changing color, a sore that doesn't heal.

THE ABCDE'S OF MELANOMA, THE FORM OF SKIN CANCER THAT IS MOST LIKELY TO METASTASIZE, OR SPREAD ALL OVER YOUR BODY:

ASYMMETRY



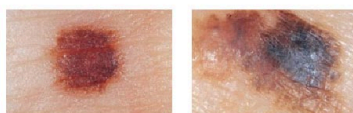
A spot that's irregular, instead of being round

BORDER



An uneven border, or a ragged edge

COLOR



Uneven color, with different shades of black and brown

DIAMETER



Larger than a pencil eraser

EVOLVING



Changes in size, color, or thickness

Other forms of skin cancer can also take different appearances:

A red, scaly patch (large or small) that won't clear up or keeps coming back

A skin-colored bump that grows slowly

A sore that won't heal

A "growing scar" -- a firm, recessed spot, either skin-colored or lighter
Melanomas and non-melanoma cancers can be either raised or flat.

The most important thing is to be familiar with your own skin and recognize changes when they occur.
