1. The AWP|Dragon Lore

Maybe the most famous skin in the video game, the Dragon Lore includes a mythical dragon breathing fire throughout the body of the sniper rifle. Originally dropped exclusively on particular maps like Cobblestone throughout major competitions, these keepsake plans are now exceptionally rare. A Factory New Souvenir Dragon Lore signed by superstar player Skadoodle famously offered for over £ 60,000 years back, and rates have just escalated because.

2. The AK-47|Case Hardened (Pattern 661 "Blue Gem")

While a basic Case Hardened AK-47 is relatively budget friendly, the top-tier pattern indices-- particularly Pattern 661-- cover almost the entire top receiver of the weapon in a pristine, reflective blue. Since the odds of unpacking this precise pattern with a great float value are astronomically low, these products have commanded personal offers surpassing 6 figures.

3. StatTrak™ M4A4|Wail

Valve updated the design and stopped it from dropping entirely. Anybody holding a Howl at that time kept it, creating a completely topped supply.
