What You Give Up When Choosing ChatHub's Native Apps

- **Orchestration Flexibility:** ChatHub mostly focuses on multi-model chat interfaces but lacks advanced orchestration modes beyond model switching. If your workflow demands complex orchestration or layered validation strategies, that's a limitation.
- **Deliverables & Exports:** While ChatHub supports chat transcripts and basic exports, its native apps don't offer rich, customizable deliverable exports like PDF, DOCX, or Markdown formats that operational teams use for final reports.

In short, ChatHub's native mobile apps fit users needing straightforward, accessible multi-model chat experiences but may fall short on enterprise-grade orchestration and final deliverable handling.

Suprmind's PWA: No Native Apps but Powerful Web Orchestration

Unlike ChatHub, **Suprmind** doesn't currently offer native Android or iOS apps. Instead, it provides a **Progressive Web App (PWA)** that runs seamlessly on any device via the browser.

- **Suprmind PWA** installs easily from your mobile or desktop browser without the need to download through an app store.

1. **Sequential Mode:** Run models one after another, feeding previous outputs downstream. Use when you want a narrative or logical build-up. Ideal for storyboarding, report generation, and iterative drafting.
2. **Super Mind Mode:** Aggregate multiple model outputs simultaneously, then combine via weighted scoring or consensus. Great for validation and identifying anomalies in data or text generation.
3. **Parallel Mode:** Run models independently and view outputs side-by-side. Useful for comparing different perspectives without combining answers directly.
4. **Conditional Mode:** Branch workflows depending on the output's nature, enabling automated decision trees.

5. **Feedback Mode:** Capture human-in-the-loop corrections that improve subsequent AI outputs.

6. **Custom Mode:** Build bespoke orchestration chains using Suprmind's API and integrations.

ChatHub primarily provides multi-model chat switching but lacks this range of structured orchestration modes, which are key when you need deliverables that must pass checks, validations, or sequential editing.
