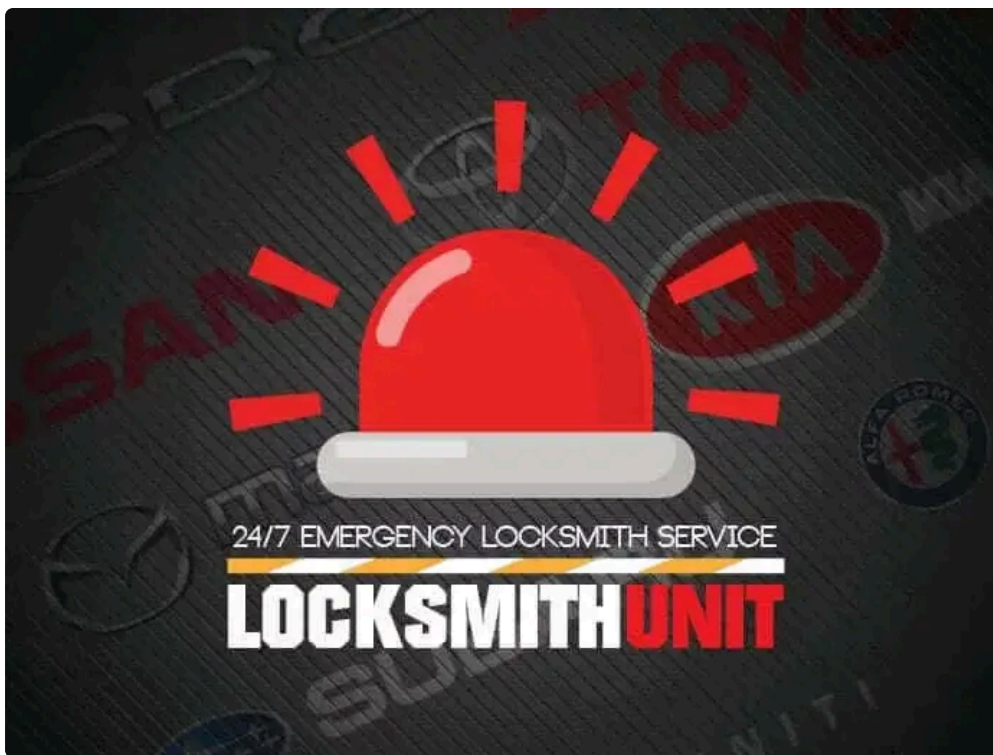

Car keys, transponders, and ignition problems
