

New Braunfels and Schertz Drivers Hurt in San Antonio Crashes Plenty of people who live in New Braunfels, Schertz, Cibolo or Converse spend a big part of their week on San Antonio roads. You might commute in on I-35, cut across on Loop 1604 or Loop 410, or head downtown for a game, a doctor's visit or an evening on the River Walk. When a crash happens on one of those trips, you're dealing with an injury in a city you don't live in, and that can feel harder than it should. Some of the spots The Aguirre Law Firm names as dangerous sit right on these routes. I-35 and North Loop 410 is one of them. San Pedro Avenue and Loop 1604 and US 281 at Loop 1604 are others that drivers crossing the north side of the city pass through. I-35 carries heavy truck traffic, and Loop 410 and Loop 1604 are busy almost around the clock. Speeding, following too closely, drunk driving and distracted driving are behind many wrecks across Bexar County. Insurance is where out-of-town crashes often get complicated. Texas is an at-fault state, so the driver who caused the crash is responsible, but the state minimum is only \$30,000 per injured person, \$60,000 per crash and \$25,000 for property damage. Many drivers carry only that, and some carry nothing at all. Your own UM/UIM coverage may help fill the gap, and PIP, which must be offered with at least \$2,500 in coverage, can help with early medical bills and lost income unless you rejected it in [Law Firm](#) writing. A careful review of every policy can reveal coverage you didn't know you had.

Most Texas car accident lawyers work on contingency, so their fee is a percentage of what they recover and nothing if they lose. The exact percentage is set out in your written fee agreement before any work starts, so there are no surprises. How hard is it to win a car accident lawsuit? It depends on the evidence. Check everyone for injuries, call 911 and get the report number from SAPD or the Bexar County Sheriff's Office. Take photos of the vehicles and the scene, get witness details and see a doctor quickly, even if you feel fine. Then call The Aguirre Law Firm, PLLC at (210) 922-0808, which is open 24 hours a day. Can I recover compensation if I was partially at fault? Yes, in many cases. Texas uses modified comparative fault, so you can still recover as long as you are less than 51 percent responsible, although your award is reduced by your share of the blame. Insurers often push extra fault onto injured drivers after crashes at busy spots like Loop 1604 and I-10, and the firm works to challenge that with evidence. Should I talk to the other driver's insurance company? It's

best not to give a recorded statement before you get legal advice. Adjusters can use casual comments like "I'm fine" to argue your injuries aren't serious. Alex Aguirre knows these tactics from his years on the defense side, and his team can handle insurer calls for you from the first day. How long do I have to file a car accident claim in Texas? Texas generally gives you two years from the date of the crash to file a personal injury lawsuit, and two years from the date of death for a wrongful death claim. Some claims, such as those involving a government vehicle, can have earlier notice requirements. Calling The Aguirre Law Firm, PLLC early gives the team time to gather evidence before it disappears. What compensation can I get after a San Antonio car wreck? You may be able to recover current and future medical costs, lost wages and earning capacity, property damage, pain and suffering, mental anguish and physical impairment. In cases of gross negligence, such as some drunk driving crashes, Texas law may also allow exemplary damages. The firm reviews every category so nothing gets left out of your claim. What if the driver who hit me has no insurance? Your own policy may still protect you. Texas insurers must offer uninsured and underinsured motorist coverage and personal injury protection, and PIP is included unless you rejected it in writing.
