Aspects That Influence Rarity

1. **Drop Rate**-- The possibility of a case looking like a random drop is incredibly low for some older cases. For instance, the Operation Bravo Case drops are roughly 0.15% compared to 1-- 2% for contemporary cases.
2. **Event Duration**-- Cases connected to limited-time operations (e.g., Bravo, Shattered Web) stop to be granted as soon as the operation ends. This produces a hard supply ceiling.
3. **Promotion Type**-- Some cases were only dispersed through purchase of specific "Starter Packs" or as rewards for participation in competitions. These promotion-only cases can be more evasive than standard drop-only boxes.
4. **Skin Popularity**-- The existence of highly desirable "Covert" or "Classified" skins pumps up demand. The AK-47 Fire Serpent, for example, makes the Operation Bravo Case specifically valuable.
5. **Age and Nostalgia**-- Early CS: GO cases bring historic significance, interesting veterans and collectors who missed out on the original release windows.

How Collectors Acquire Rare Cases

- **Steam Marketplace:** The primary location for acquiring cases outright. Prices are set by sellers; market costs apply.
- **Third-Party Trading Sites:** Platforms such as CSGOSkins.gg, Skinbay, or Buff.163 frequently list cases at a little lower commissions, however verify seller track record.
- **Community Giveaways & Events:** Occasionally, Valve or neighborhood influencers host giveaways where older cases are awarded. Taking part in main CS: GO competitions can also yield tradition case drops.
- **Bundle Purchase:** Some collectors buy "mystery boxes" that might contain older cases; however, this technique is risky and often not cost-effective.

Tips for New Collectors

- **Stay Updated:** Follow Valve's official blog, r/CSGO, and dedicated skin-price trackers (e.g., CSGOstash) for news on upcoming operations or case re-releases.
