Nevertheless, Valve operates differently than a lot of publishers. They rarely follow market patterns simply since they are profitable. Unless Valve finds a method to bridge the gap in between PC and mobile without jeopardizing the competitive integrity of Counter-Strike-- or up until Steam Deck hardware entirely redefines portable PC gaming-- a main **CS2 mobile video game** stays unlikely.
