If a player receives a skin in a trade, they can not trade it again for a complete week. This significantly interrupted the automated, high-frequency trading bots used by CSGO casinos.
- **Account Bans:** Valve consistently bans accounts related to commercial gambling, resulting in millions of dollars worth of skins being locked completely inside prohibited stocks.
