

What Happens at Your First Meeting With an Omaha Law Firm Expect to do most of the talking. A first meeting is a structured conversation in which you explain what happened or what you want to accomplish, the attorney asks follow-up questions, and together you decide whether the firm can help and what the next steps would look like. Some preparation makes that hour far more useful. When you call to schedule, staff will usually ask for the names of everyone involved so the firm can run a conflict check, which confirms it does not already represent someone on the other side. Bring whatever paperwork relates to your matter: contracts, emails, letters from an agency or opposing lawyer, prior wills or trust documents, corporate records, or pay records if the question involves employees. A short written timeline helps too. If a court or agency deadline is approaching, mention it at the start, because some deadlines in Nebraska cannot be extended. In the room, expect questions that seem basic but matter a great deal. The attorney will want to know what you hope to achieve, what has already been tried, and what a good result looks like to you. Before you leave, ask how the firm will communicate, who your main contact will be, and how fees and billing will work. If you decide to go forward, the firm will send an engagement letter describing the scope of the work, and representation begins once that is signed. Many people who first came in about a single issue, perhaps a lease for a shop in the Old Market or a will after a move to Elkhorn, end up keeping the same Omaha law firm for years. Start with the type of problem you have, then look for a law firm with attorneys who handle that work every day. Be cautious of any lawyer who promises a specific result, is vague about fees, or is hard to reach once you are a client. Charles V. Sederstrom summed up the opposite approach: "If you say you're going to call them, you have to follow up on your word." Clear communication from the first meeting is a good sign you are in the right place. What should I look for in a larger Omaha law firm? Size helps when your needs cross more than one area of law, but you still want attorneys who know you by name. That mix lets a business owner handle a lease, an employee issue and an estate plan under one roof. What does a full-service law firm handle? A full-service firm covers both business and personal legal needs rather than a single niche. tax, construction, insurance, intellectual property and aviation law. Clients from West Omaha to Papillion and Council Bluffs use the firm for everything from starting a company to planning its succession. When should an Omaha business hire a corporate lawyer? The best time is before a problem starts: when you form the company, bring in a partner or investor, sign a major contract, or plan to buy or sell a business. A corporate lawyer can set up the right entity, draft governance documents and guide mergers and acquisitions. Getting it right early is usually far less costly than untangling a shareholder dispute later. Do I need an estate planning attorney in Nebraska? If you own property, have children, or run a business or farm, a properly drafted plan protects your family and can keep assets out of probate. Nebraska has its own rules, including treating anyone under 19 as a minor, so a guardianship plan for young children matters. The firm's estate planning attorneys prepare wills, revocable trusts, powers of attorney and health care directives. How long does probate take in Nebraska? Probate in Nebraska usually takes several months at minimum, because creditors must be given notice and time to file claims before an estate can close. Contested matters or complex assets can stretch that much longer. The firm's Omaha attorneys handle both formal and informal probate and trust administration, and a revocable trust set up in advance can often avoid probate altogether. What does an employment attorney do for employers? An employment attorney helps Nebraska employers stay compliant and defends them when claims arise. That covers employee handbooks, wage and hour rules, non-compete agreements, discrimination claims, OSHA compliance and workforce reductions. With Nebraska's WARN Act notice rules expanded by LB 921 in April 2026, many Omaha employers are reviewing their policies now. What is business litigation? Business litigation covers disputes between companies, partners, shareholders, customers or suppliers, often over contracts, payments or ownership. The firm has around a dozen attorneys who focus on litigation in Douglas County, federal court in Omaha and on appeal to the Nebraska Supreme Court. Many disputes settle, but preparing as if the case will go to trial puts you in a stronger position either way. Can an Omaha law firm help with matters in Iowa? Yes, if its attorneys are licensed there.
