



There are towns that seem built for date night, and Manitou Springs is one of them. The streets are walkable, the mountain air changes the pace of the evening, and even a simple dinner feels a little more memorable when it happens against the backdrop of historic buildings and steep hillsides. In a place like this, the right restaurant does not need to be flashy to feel special.
