

Garage Door Repair Services in Los Angeles

Typical Garage Door Issues Homeowners Encounter

Failed Springs, Cables, and Rollers

Damaged **garage door cables** can fray, loosen, or come off the drums. A technician should check the rollers, hinges, drums, bearings, and fasteners rather than replacing one visible part without inspecting the entire lifting system.
