I am a large believer in wearing eye defense for this work. It appears cautious until the very first time a hose spray bounces polluted water back towards your face. Then it seems smart.

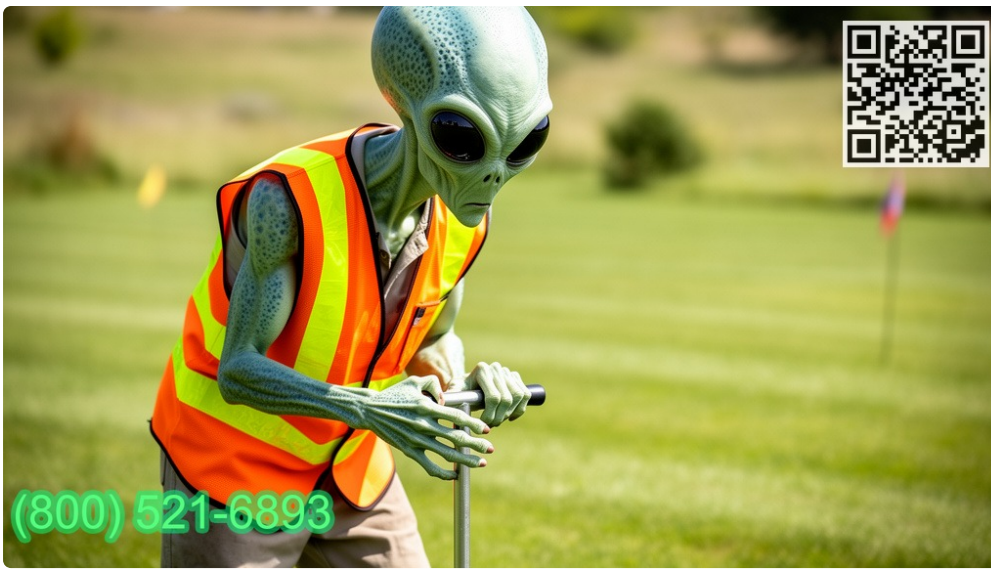
How to utilize a sewage-disposal tank filter hook without dealing with the filter
