

Pain and Suffering Damages After a Midland Car Crash A hospital bill arrives with a number printed at the bottom. A night spent awake because your shoulder aches when you roll over doesn't. That's the basic difference between economic and non-economic damages, and it's why pain and suffering claims take more work to prove. Texas law allows injured people to seek compensation for physical pain, mental anguish, physical impairment and disfigurement, along with the bills and lost wages that are easier to add up. The hard part is showing an insurance adjuster what those losses look like in your actual life. Think about the ordinary things a crash can take from you. Maybe you used to walk the trails at Hogan Park after work and now you can't get past the parking lot. Maybe you skipped a RockHounds game at Momentum Bank Ballpark with your kids because sitting in the stands hurt too much. Maybe you still flinch every time you merge onto Loop 250 near Big Spring Street. None of that shows up on a receipt, but all of it is real, and all of it can be part of a claim. The best tool for proving it is simple. Keep a journal. A few lines a day is plenty. Write down your pain level, what you couldn't do, how you slept and how you felt. Note the birthday party you left early, the shift you couldn't finish and the anxiety that hits at intersections. Photos of bruises, braces and stitches help as well. Months later, when an adjuster suggests you've recovered, a steady daily record is hard to argue with.

If you were hurt, missed work or the other driver's insurer is disputing fault, a lawyer usually pays for themselves. Most car accident lawyers work on contingency, meaning the fee is a percentage of what they recover and nothing if they lose. The exact percentage is set out in writing in your fee agreement before any work begins. How much of a \$25,000 settlement will I actually receive? Texas gives you two years from the crash to file most injury lawsuits, but waiting that long is risky. Camera footage from businesses along Loop 250 or Wadley Avenue can be erased within days, and witness memories fade fast.
