The wear is categorized into five unique exterior conditions:



Condition Drift Value Range Description **Factory New (FN)** 0.00-- 0.07 Beautiful condition with little to no noticeable scratches or use. Generally the most pricey. **Minimal Wear (MW)** 0.07-- 0.15 Slight acnes or scratches, frequently only obvious on close examination. **Field-Tested (FT)** 0.15-- 0.38 Visible wear, scratches, and fading. This is the most typical condition. **Well-Worn (WW)** 0.38-- 0.45 Substantial wear. Parts of the paint may look chipped or greatly faded. **Battle-Scarred (BS)** 0.45-- 1.00 Extreme wear. The weapon looks greatly rusted, beaten, or almost removed of paint.

Keep in mind: Some skins are "capped," implying they can not drop in Factory New condition, while others really look better with greater wear (known as "Blackimovs" on specific AWP models).

2. Rarity Tiers and Drop Rates

Skins are color-coded based upon their rarity. This rarity dictates how difficult the product is to acquire through random drops or by opening weapon cases with keys.

- **Consumer Grade (White):** Common, standard drops.
- **Industrial Grade (Light Blue):** Slightly better than Consumer Grade.
- **Mil-Spec (Blue):** Standard quality for a lot of collection drops and low-tier case items.
- **Restricted (Purple):** Uncommon; often utilized as trade-up fodder.
- **Categorized (Pink):** Rare, extremely in-demand weapon surfaces.

- **Covert (Red):** The greatest standard rarity found in cases, featuring renowned designs like the AWP|Asiimov or M4A4|Growl.
- **Extremely Rare (★ Gold):** Special items, including Knives and Gloves.

Approximate Case Odds

Opening cases is a form of gambling, and the chances greatly favor your home. According to community research and Valve's official disclosures in specific areas, the rough likelihoods of unpacking items are:

- **Mil-Spec (Blue):** ~ 79.92%
- **Restricted (Purple):** ~ 15.98%
- **Classified (Pink):** ~ 3.20%
- **Covert (Red):** ~ 0.64%
- **Special Item (★ Gold/Knife/Gloves):** ~ 0.26%

3. The Anatomy of Skin Value

Why does a digital knife cost £ 1,500 while a pistol skin costs three cents? Numerous financial and aesthetic aspects determine the rate of a CS: GO skin:

1. **Demand and Popularity:** Guns used frequently in competitive play (like the AK-47, M4A1-S, and AWP) naturally command higher rates than specific niche weapons like the Negev or Bizon.
2. **Expert Play:** When a famous esports player (like s1mple, ZywOo, or NiKo) makes an amazing play using a particular skin, its price frequently increases overnight.
3. **Pattern Templates:** Certain skins use a randomized pattern index (0 to 999).
 - *Case Hardened* skins, for example, can have an enormous quantity of "blue gem" protection, driving their costs into tens of countless dollars.
 - *Fade* percentages identify how much of the rainbow gradient is noticeable on the gun.
4. **Stickers and Souvenirs:** Applying professional tournament sticker labels can often add worth, specifically if they are unusual autographs or from discontinued Major champions.

- **The Asiimov Series:** Known for its futuristic, sci-fi, orange-and-white robotic visual. Available on the AWP, M4A4, P250, and P90.
