Popular Game Modes on CS: GO Gambling Platforms

- **Case Opening & Battles:** Simulating the main Valve case openings, but often with considerably much better (or completely transparent) odds. Case battles enable multiple gamers to open the very same cases, with the individual pulling the greatest overall worth winning all the items.
- **Crash:** A multiplier starts at 1.00 x and quickly increases. Gamers need to cash out before the multiplier "crashes." If they stop working to do so in time, they lose their stake.
- **Roulette:** Similar to standard casino roulette, however typically adjusted with 3 colors (e.g., Red, Black, and Green), where Green offers a huge payment due to lower chances.
- **Coinflip:** A traditional 1v1 video game where two players wager comparable skin worths, and a digital coin flip determines the sole winner.

- **Jackpot:** Multiple players dump skins into a common pot. A virtual wheel spins, and the person who contributed the most has the highest statistical chance of winning the entire swimming pool, though luck can favor low-tier contributors.
