Field-Tested (FT)	0.15-- 0.38	Visible wear, scratches, and small paint breaking on high-friction areas.
Well-Worn (WW)	0.38-- 0.45	Substantial wear, fading colors, and prominent scratches.

Scarred (BS) 0.45-- 1.00 Heavily distressed, rusted, or scraped away, frequently offering the weapon a gritty, industrial appearance.

The CS2 Economy: Rarity Tiers

Skins are classified into various rarity tiers, which dictate their drop rates in-game or acquisition rates through weapon cases. Understanding these tiers is essential for anyone looking to comprehend the market value of their inventory.

- **Customer Grade (White):** Common, fundamental weapon surfaces, typically found in weekly gameplay drops.
- **Industrial Grade (Light Blue):** Slightly less common than customer grade, however still typically low-value.
- **Mil-Spec (Dark Blue):** The basic baseline for most collection and case skins.
- **Restricted (Purple):** Often forms the middle tier of case drops; visually striking and reasonably priced.
- **Categorized (Pink):** High-tier weapons that feature complicated artwork and command substantial market attention.
- **Covert (Red):** The highest standard weapon tier, featuring the most sought-after rifle and SMG finishes in the game.
- **Unique Item (Gold/Exotic):** The rarest tier, incorporating knives and representative gloves.
