The "Rare Special Item" tier (typically called "Gold") is the most coveted. The chances of receiving a gold product are usually listed below 1%, which explains why [cs2 cases](#) these skins can fetch hundreds or perhaps thousands of dollars on the Steam Market.

4. The Economics of Opening Cases

4.1 Cost Overview

- **Case rate:** varies, frequently in between £ 0.50 and £ 3.00 on the market.
- **Key price:** fixed at £ 2.50 (GBP) from the in-game store.

Thus, the overall cost to open a single case usually varies from **£ 3.00 to £ 5.50**.

4.2 Expected Return

Since most of items prevail (Mil-Spec) and the rarer skins appear only a small portion of the time, the **expected value** of opening a case is far lower than the expense. - **Usage two-factor authentication:** Protect your Steam account with Steam Guard to avoid unauthorized access to your inventory and market transactions.

7.1 What are the specific odds of getting a Rare Special Item?
