- **The Martingale System:** A timeless betting technique where a player doubles their bet after every loss. The theory is that a single win will recuperate all previous losses plus a revenue equal to the initial base bet. However, this requires a massive bankroll and can rapidly strike website wagering limitations.
- **The Reverse Martingale (Paroli):** Players double their bets after a *win* instead of a loss, trying to ride a winning streak while keeping losses reduced to the base bet amount.
- **The Moonshot Strategy:** Placing little bets with the intent of holding out for huge multipliers (50x, 100x, or higher). This operates similar to playing the lottery game.

Advantages and disadvantages of CS: GO Crash
