(Note: These percentages apply to the base item tier. If an item drops, there is an extra 10% possibility that it will include StatTrak innovation, which reduces the base chances of getting a specific product variation even further.)

To put these numbers into point of view, the possibility of unpacking an uncommon, high-tier Knife or set of Gloves is approximately **1 in 385**.

Understanding Float Values and Conditions

Even if a gamer beats the chances and lands a high-tier item, the battle is just half won. Every weapon dropped from a case is appointed a **Float Value**-- a number in between 0.00 and 1.00 that determines the wear condition of the skin.

The wear conditions are categorized as follows:

- **Factory New (FN):** 0.00-- 0.07
- **Very Little Wear (MW):** 0.07-- 0.15
- **Field-Tested (FEET):** 0.15-- 0.37
- **Well-Worn (WW):** 0.37-- 0.45
- **Battle-Scarred (BS):** 0.45-- 1.00

Different skins have different wear limits. Some skins can not be acquired in Factory New condition, meaning the top-tier float worths are incredibly uncommon and command enormous prices on the Steam Community Market.

Why Do Players Keep Opening Cases?

With such overwhelming odds, why is the case-opening economy worth billions of dollars? The psychology behind CS: GO case odds relies heavily on cognitive predispositions.

- **The Near-Miss Effect:** Watching the cursor slowly tick past a Gold product and arrive on an inexpensive Blue product activates the very same psychological reaction in the brain as a win, encouraging another effort.
- **Variable Reward Schedules:** Much like a slot machine, the unpredictability of the reward keeps players engaged. You never understand *when* the payout will happen, just that it *might* take place on the next shot.
- **The Investment Illusion:** Some players view case opening as a financial investment, wanting to pull an unusual product that will appreciate in worth over time.

However, data prove that the "House" often wins in the long run. The Expected Value (EV) of opening a case is nearly generally lower than the combined expense of the case and the secret.

Tips for Navigating the CS: GO/CS2 Economy

Yes! Rare Special Items (Knives and Gloves) can be discovered in practically all basic weapon cases. The particular swimming pool of knives depends on the case, but the total probability of hitting the "Gold" tier stays around 0.26%.
