

Garage Door Repair Services in Los Angeles

A reliable garage door is important for safety, ease, and entry to your home. Whether an automatic garage door stops responding, an overhead garage door becomes noisy, or the door will not move evenly, a skilled garage door technician can identify the cause and suggest the right repair.

Signs of spring failure include a sharp bang, a door that feels much heavier, or a door that only opens a few inches. The correct spring depends on the door’s weight, height, track configuration, and cycle rating.

A garage door cable transfers spring tension and helps keep the door level. Frayed, loose, or broken cables should not be handled without caution because they may be under substantial force. A worn garage door roller can create vibration, squealing, or resistance, especially when it moves through a worn track.

Professional torsion spring replacement or extension spring service should include a balance test, hardware inspection, and operational test. Never attempt to remove a spring without the proper tools and training.

A rattling garage door may have worn rollers, loose hinges, dry bearings, an obstructed track, or an opener that requires service. If the door is crooked or has come off its tracks, stop operating it. Garage door alignment problems can result from an impact, loose hardware, cable failure, uneven spring tension, or a damaged garage door track. Door track repair may involve securing brackets, replacing sections, correcting spacing, or installing new rollers.

A qualified safety inspection should test the door's balance, reversing function, cables, springs, tracks, fasteners, and opener force settings. The technician can also check whether the bottom seal is damaged or allowing pests, dust, and water into the garage.

Symptoms such as "garage door won't open" or "garage door won't close" may originate with the opener, remote, wall control, photo-eye sensors, spring system, or physical obstruction. Avoid replacing parts based only on a symptom; a diagnosis can prevent unnecessary expense.

Verify them by placing an suitable object in the opening following the manufacturer's instructions; the door should reopen rather than close on the obstruction. Do not disable or bypass the sensors.

Check the door visually for worn cables, broken rollers, unstable hinges, warped tracks, damaged panels, and damaged springs. Be alert for a new noisy garage door or changes in speed. If the door will not close, check for an obstruction or dusty sensor lenses, but request professional service if the issue continues.
