3. Diversify Your Case Selection

Avoid discarding your entire budget plan into a single high-tier case like *Operation Bravo* or *Recoil*. Rather, mix low-tier, stable-return cases with a few high-variance cases to balance the danger.

4. Use "Crazy Mode" Cautiously

Crazy Mode (where the most affordable overall worth wins) flips basic logic on its head. While it can be fun, it relies entirely on hitting low-cost, low-tier drops. Do not approach this mode with basic case-opening logic.
