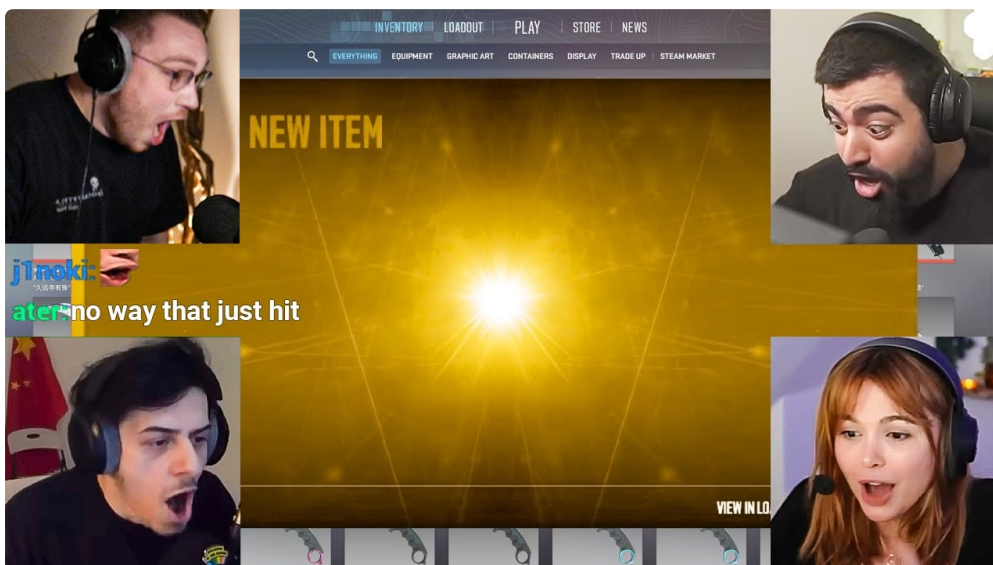
Popular Case Battle Game Modes
