Low (Platform commission) **Plinko/ Mines** Casual arcade-style gambling games adjusted from classic game shows and puzzle ideas. Medium

How the CS2 Gambling Ecosystem Works

To comprehend how a CS2 gambling establishment functions, one must look at the technical pipeline that allows virtual products to be transformed into gambling capital and back into cash.

1. Steam API and Peer-to-Peer (P2P) Trading

Valve has traditionally punished automated trading bots to suppress gambling websites. In action, modern-day CS2 casinos use **Peer-to-Peer (P2P) markets**. When a gamer wishes to deposit skins:

- The platform matches the gamer's deposit request with another user who wishes to withdraw that specific skin.

- **Addiction and Mental Health:** The gamified nature of opening digital cases and chasing losses can trigger compulsive gambling habits, particularly amongst younger audiences who form the core demographic of CS2.
