



When Celebrations Clash with Schedules

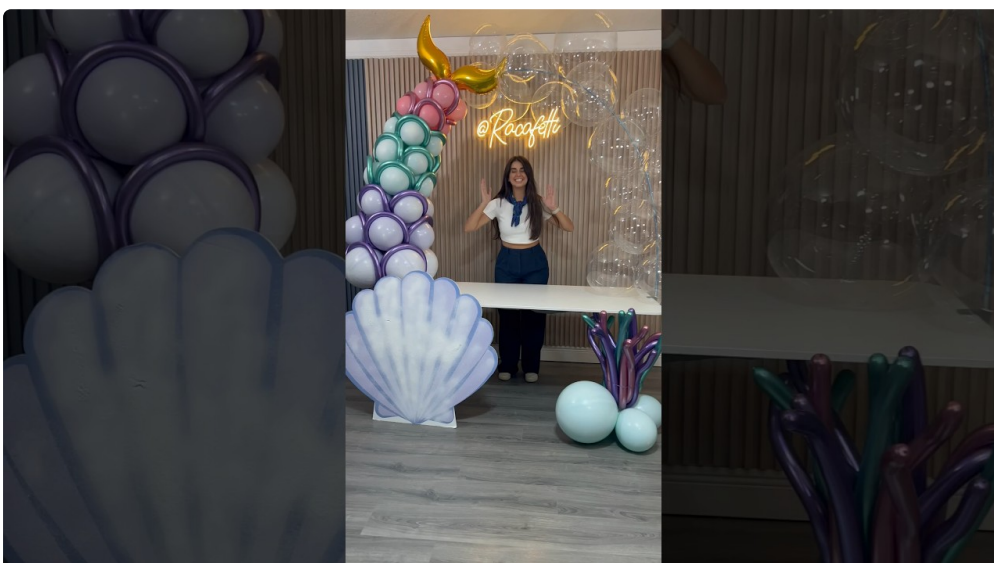
