

The very first time I assisted a next-door neighbor set up a sprinkler system, we reserved one weekend. We completed on the third, sore, sunburnt, and a little humbled. The system functioned, although we invested the following month dialing in head positioning, dealing with little leaks, and finding out why water stress on paper does not always match what comes out of a trench line after 8 tees and a surge in grade.
