1. The AWP|Dragon Lore

Possibly the most popular skin in the game, the Dragon Lore features a mythical dragon breathing fire across the body of the sniper rifle. Initially dropped specifically on particular maps like Cobblestone throughout significant competitions, these souvenir bundles are now extremely rare. A Factory **cs2 case opening results** New Souvenir Dragon Lore signed by superstar gamer Skaddoodle notoriously sold for over £ 60,000 years back, and rates have only escalated since.

2. The AK-47|Case Hardened (Pattern 661 "Blue Gem")

While a standard Case Hardened AK-47 is fairly budget friendly, the top-tier pattern indices-- particularly Pattern 661-- cover nearly the entire leading receiver of the weapon in a beautiful, reflective blue.
