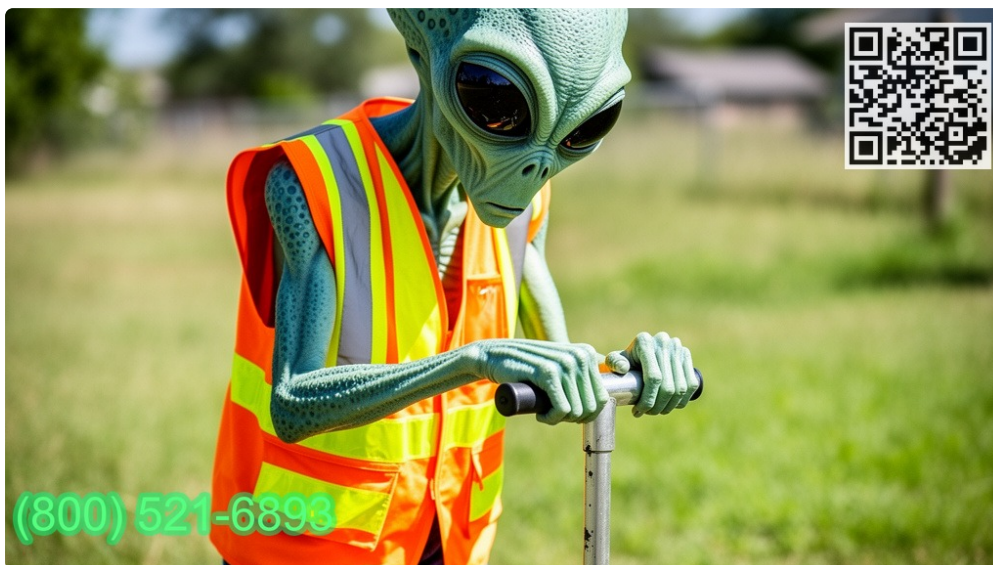
How to locate a septic tank without ruining the yard
