1. **Size Matters:** Make labels large enough to read at a glance, but not so big they crowd your small snack trays or cocktail stations.
2. **Clear, Simple Wording:** Use short, descriptive names— "Crispy Herb Parmesan Popcorn" feels more gourmet than "Popcorn."
3. **Highlight Allergens or Dietary Info:** A small icon or word like "GF" or "Vegan" helps guests identify options instantly. The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) also reminds hosts to be mindful of food safety and ingredient transparency.
4. **Label Placement:** Position tent cards or labels at the front edge of trays or drink stations to avoid guests knocking them over mid-game.
5. **Use Frames or Holders:** A small battery candle or frame can elevate tent cards and prevent them from falling flat.
6. **Label Drinks Too:** Signature cocktails or mocktails with creative names tied to your casino theme score high on guest satisfaction.
