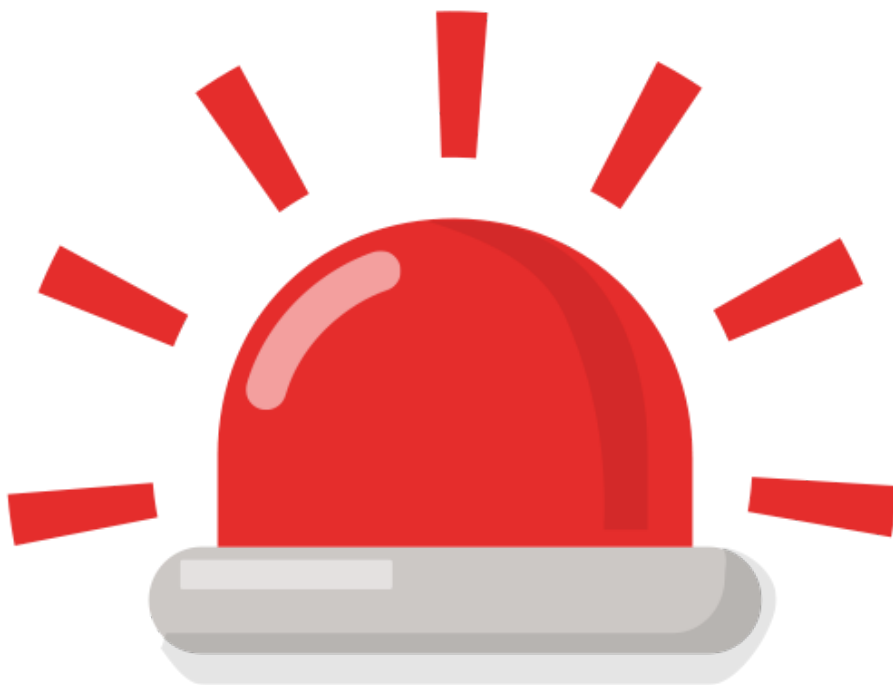

prices. Other times the right answer is repair, replacement, or programming, depending on how the hardware failed in the first place.

The practical case for keeping good hardware

If the hardware is solid, the door closes properly, and the main issue is key control, changing the pins inside the cylinder can restore security without replacing the whole lock. The answer is usually yes when the finish is intact and the mechanism still turns smoothly.
