High pressure in the wrong place can force water behind siding, strip paint, or scar softer materials. Low pressure with the wrong chemistry can leave streaks behind or fail to clear organic buildup. Decks are another area where judgment matters. A weathered cedar deck near the water can be gorgeous, but it can also be fragile. Push too much pressure into the grain and it will fuzz up, leaving a rough surface that accepts stain unevenly.
