

The FIFA World Cup semi-final match between Brazil and Germany on 8 July 2014 remains one of the most jaw-dropping, brain-melting moments in football history. These five goals—scored from the 23rd to the 29th minute—were more than just freak events; the expected goals (xG) values confirm Germany's clinical finishing with high-quality chances. Contrast this with Brazil's xG of just 0.1 during this spell, reflecting Germany's dominance.

Football's Unpredictability: Lessons from a Historic Upset

While expected goals models and possession statistics help quantify performance, they do not capture the essential unpredictability of football. The 2014 semi-final underscored how momentum swings and psychological pressure can create cascades of events destroying even the most talented sides.
