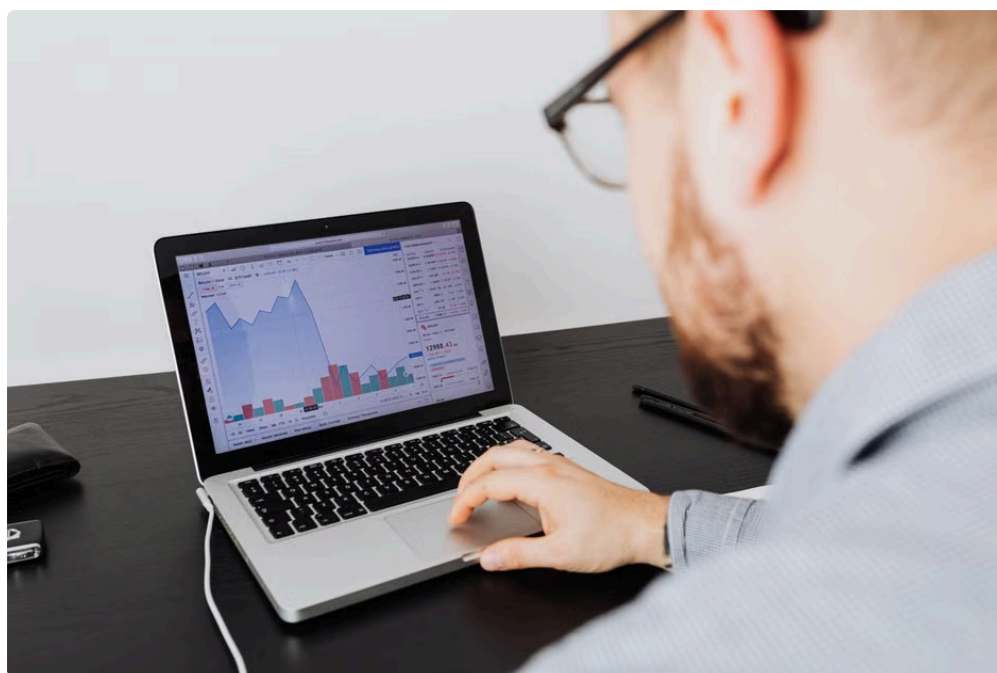

Perplexity Model Council tends toward enterprise pricing with tailored plans, often bundled into broader Perplexity platform access. This is typical given its complex multi-model orchestration capabilities.
