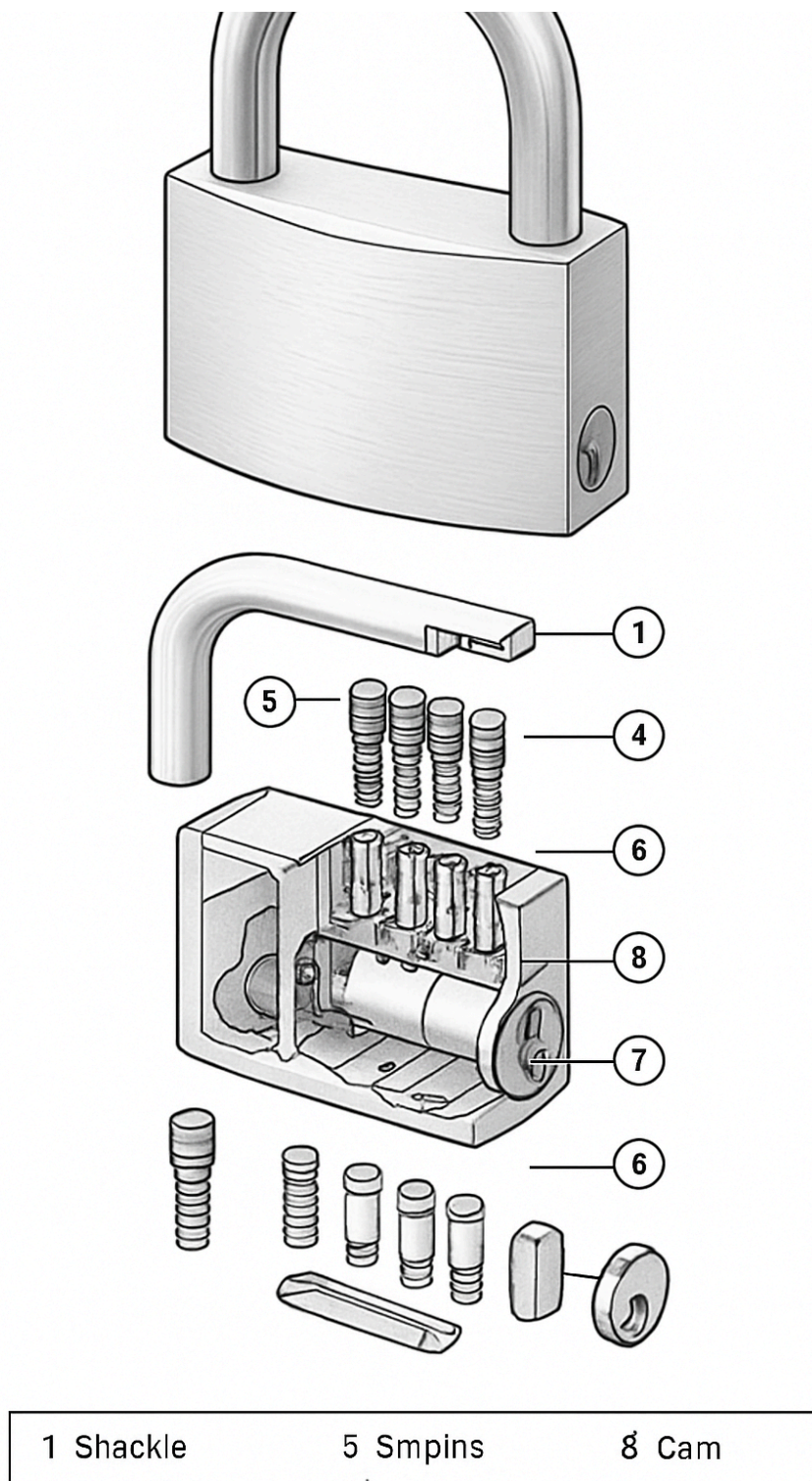
Where emergency service matters most
