While the numeric count is a simple metric, it reveals much about the ease of navigation. Lower click counts generally correlate with better user satisfaction.

Finally, all these factors culminate in the overall user experience, which is a critical loyalty driver. Why do players stay loyal to one site instead of hopping from casino to casino?

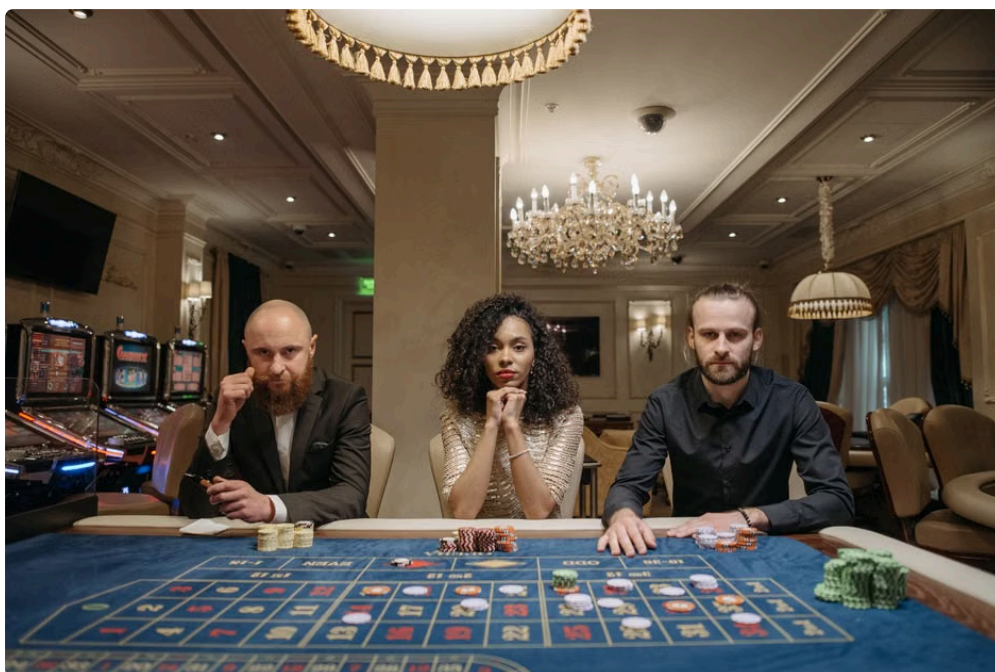
