

Most refrigerators reach their natural end-of-life threshold between 10 and 15 years, with the most cost-effective replacement window occurring around the 12-year mark when reliability decline becomes steep and repair expenses mount rapidly. At what point does your refrigerator's age make replacement more economical than repairs?

A 3-year-old refrigerator with a compressor issue might justify a \$600 repair; that same \$600 repair on a 13-year-old unit signals that end-of-life replacement makes more sense financially. As your refrigerator ages beyond 10 years, its remaining service life shrinks, meaning each repair dollar buys you fewer years of future operation. What replacement window makes the most economic sense for your household?

The ideal replacement window for a refrigerator occurs between years 11 and 14, after the initial warranty and early reliability phase have ended but before the end-of-life depreciation becomes severe. Waiting until year 15 or 16 often means absorbing emergency repair costs that rival or exceed the price of a new unit, plus the risk of food loss during a breakdown. Replacing before year 10 abandons remaining service life and misses the point of owning the appliance.
