Why rekeying is different from replacement

The lock stays on the door, the internal pins or tumblers are adjusted, and old keys stop working when the job is finished. A business owner may want the same reset after an employee leaves, after a vendor relationship ends, or after keys have gone missing.

That said, rekeying is not the answer if the lock is broken, the cylinder is worn out, or the door hardware is already unreliable. That judgment is where experience matters more than a sales pitch.

Moving into a house almost always raises the same question, who still has a key? In many of those cases, the homeowner is not chasing a dramatic upgrade, just a clean reset from a [house locksmith](#) who can make the existing doors match a new key.

The cost of waiting is not always theft, sometimes it is simply stress that could have been avoided with a small service call. A rekey is also common after a roommate move-out or a short-term rental turnover, because the old key should not remain part of the security picture.

Broken hardware tells a different story, and that is where lock repair or lock replacement starts to look smarter than rekeying. That habit saves customers money and avoids the common mistake of paying twice for the same door.

When a business needs lock changes instead of repairs

Commercial rekeying is less emotional than residential work, but the stakes are often higher.
